INTRODUCTION

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. When you were growing up, what were you taught about managing money? Did that advice help or harm you
- 2. Read Luke 16:1–15. Because of their love of money, the Pharisees sneered at Jesus' parable. Are there parts of the parable that you resist or that make you uncomfortable? If so, which parts are they? Why do they make you uncomfortable?
- 3. Respond to the idea that your money and possessions are tools to be used to introduce others to Jesus. How are you challenged by that idea?
- 4. During the message, Ps. Daniel said, "How we manage what we assume is ours reflects our devotion to the One to whom it actually belongs." Do you agree? Why or why not?
- 5. Would a person know you belong to God based on the way you manage your money and possessions? Why or why not?
- 6. At The Rocks], we believe in giving a percentage giving to God through the local church (including Kingdom Builders for our building fund). Share with the group what has been your joy and/or struggle in your percentage giving and/or Kingdom Builders.
